News from the Clergy



Sometimes I am amazed at how quickly time passes by. It is now six months since I was in front of Bishop Robert in Exeter Cathedral when he laid his hands on me as I began my term as a deacon, but it seems like only a few weeks. However sometimes time seems to drag as I wait for that promised parcel to arrive, checking my email for updates.

I would imagine two centuries ago Jesus' disciples might have experienced these two different ways that time passes by.

The whirlwind three years of Jesus' time of ministry as it climaxed in a pressure-cooker Jerusalem, with the noise and the crowds, the excitement and the passion. So much changed from the joy of Palm Sunday with the crowds cheering Jesus on, riding into Jerusalem to the horror of Good Friday as those same crowds bayed for His blood, His death.

There was the snail's pace of time from Passover on the Thursday to Easter Sunday. Did the minutes drag by as Pilate and Herod deliberated over how to deal with Jesus? Was the experience of a public lashing too long to bear?

Saturday - the day after the crucifixion.....I can imagine the disciples thinking that their world had caved in, the batteries had run out, their energy was sapped, while all they could do was wait and wait and wait until the Sabbath was at last over and they could go to tend to Jesus' body. How long each passing hour must have seemed.

Writing this in the season of Lent, I am fortunate that I know that after Good Friday came Easter Sunday. We are able to look beyond

the cross to the empty tomb. Those same disciples were shocked out of their socks as they found not the body of their dear friend, but a gaping, open tomb!

Did time speed up as the truth dawned on them? As they pieced together all the teaching they had heard the penny dropped: Jesus had risen from the dead! He was ALIVE!

The early church was able to share the fervour and excitement of the resurrection with all who would listen, and their excitement was contagious - in those first weeks after that first Easter Sunday the embryonic church blossomed and grew.

At St Matthias we seem to be growing as a church as well, and some of that is no doubt due to the excitement that others can see in us as we celebrate the life that Jesus gives when we know him personally.

In his gospel, the Apostle John recalls Jesus telling the disciples that he came so that they (and we) might experience life in all its fullness.

For this reason some of us will be wearing white and/or gold at church on Easter Sunday, because it is a day of great celebration celebration that because Jesus has risen from the dead, we can enjoy a full life!

I hope you will be able to join us on Easter Day. For the early risers there is a traditional communion service at 8:00am. For others there is our informal BreakfastZone at 09:15 or an All Age communion at 10:30. I wish you all a Joyful Easter!

ALISON BASTARD O.B.E.

3 February 1926 - 15 February 2015

I was grateful to Alison's family for suggesting that I might speak of her at the very special Service on 2nd March, and to John Beckett for so willingly allowing me that privilege.

Alison was one of the best Churchwardens I have ever known - so wise, loyal to the local congregation and helpful to all. Her inclusive approach to everyone enabled her to be a point of great unity. Likewise Guy before her, and both of them with such welcoming beaming smiles.

Alison's security and obvious stability as a much loved member of the community came I think partly from her very supportive upbringing on a farm at St. Tudy in North Cornwall where she loved the outdoor life, especially horse riding and tennis. Guy, who she married in 1948, was 15 years older - they were such a beacon of encouragement with their happy and hospitable home.

The other factor which helped to form Alison as a shining example to us all was her long term and unshakable trust in God as our Maker; and in the love of Jesus Christ and His death and resurrection for us. Alison's commitment to worship week by week, and daily prayer and witness were absolutely formative of her character.

A vast crowd of people came to give thanks for Alison on Monday, 2nd March, including a strikingly large percentage of men. Many organisations in the Bay were represented, not by a nominal person, but by large clusters of folk who clearly just wanted to be there. We sang strong hymns with a direct challenge, and Lynne, Paul and Kerry all gave clear and forthright readings. Sylvia Barratt led the intercessions and the Rev. John Beckett held the whole Service together with the special prayers of Commendation. Mike Hackeson (organ) and Barry Dunnage (trumpet) led the music along with a St. Matthias' choir.

We thought of Alison in her St. George's Road house for 59 years, her work for Relate; as a J.P; Chair of the Licencing Committee; Chair of the Magistrates Bench; helper for the homeless people's Centre; and as one of the Street Pastors. At 88, being out until 4 a.m. on a Saturday/Sunday was quite something! Such was Alison's desire to be involved with mission. (She and Guy joined a team we took to a large village in Somerset in 1983 and both played a vital part in sharing their faith there.)

At the Service I mentioned Alison's love of driving, of parties, of baking, and keeping in touch with student leaders to whom they had given accommodation, but I forgot to mention her love of football. (I hope Paul will forgive me!) Alison was a long term supporter of Torquay United.

Also, of course, the Cornish. Alison led the Torbay Cornish Association for several years and often went away to the social gatherings of Associations in other parts of the U.K. So it was fitting that Trelawny was played by Mike and Barry as the cortege left the church.

Then we all went to the Hall for pasties and saffron cake etc!

So, with a small ageing membership, which includes some long-standing adoptees, we try to find people who are willing to give their time to give a presentation to a small group.

Readers are <u>most</u> welcome to attend our meetings. A love of Cornwall is the only criteria. There is no pressure to join up, but we would of course be delighted at an increase in membership even if as an adoptee!

We meet in the Mary Alexander Lounge at St Matthias Church Centre at 2.30pm on the last Thursday of each month with the exception of July, August and December. Payment at the door is £1.50 for tea and saffron cake. Do join us.

YOUTH UPDATE

The Young Peoples Service (YPS)



We launched the YPS back in October, and thought this would be a good opportunity to update you on what's been going on.

We get about 8 – 10 young people attending each month along with a similar number of adults, who are as involved as the young people. We look at a range of themes including: Mission, Risk and the Fruits of the Spirit.

The aim of the service is to create an environment where the young people have more space to explore God and faith together, through games, worship and discussion. We are trying to give them space to contribute ideas and take part in the service and are praying that God will use the space to develop the gifts that he has put in each of them.

We also like to try new things in worship. In the last service, we spent some time worshipping God by writing who God is to each of us on lining paper (photo included). There was such a special atmosphere created through this act, and the adults were blessed and surprised by what the young people were writing about God. It is lovely to see the same faith that I have, being demonstrated in these young people - to know that they actually know who God is, brings so much hope for the future.

Will you join us in praying for this service, especially on the 15th March when John and I will be talking about being filled with the Holy Spirit? Also pray:

- That the young people continue to grow through this service
- That those of us leading will encourage and facilitate youth participation and leadership
- That our young people will be prompted to invite their friends along
