# We should have planted the plum trees by now...

...but apparently we still have a few weeks before it is too late. The aim is to plant them during the cold winter so that the roots go on developing in order to provide for better growth in the spring and fruit in the summer.

It can be a bit like that with our Christian lives. Strange as it may seem, it can be in the tough times that we grow most, and

end up being more fruitful for God as a result.

Look at Jesus – as soon as he was baptised by his cousin John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit sent him out into the desert for 40 days where he did not eat a thing and was tempted by the Devil.

Lent is the period of 40 weekdays between Ash Wednesday and Easter when we remember Jesus and this tough time in his life, which served as essential preparation for his teaching and healing ministry to come.

For centuries, the church has used it as a time to have a more in-depth look at our faith and living, to develop our roots. We remember the value of silence and the benefit of learning self discipline, perhaps by abstaining from some luxury or comfort or even trying a short fast by missing the odd meal.

We see how Jesus used that time to concentrate on the Bible teaching in God's Word, and was able to use it to help resist the temptations brought before him. And if Jesus needed that help, how much more do we? (As Oscar Wilde once said, "I can resist everything but temptation".)

So how might you use Lent this year? Give up some of your busyness and spend some time in silence before God each day? If you do not already do so, read a bit of the bible each day? (There are some suggested daily readings elsewhere in this magazine).

If you've never tried being quiet for any length of time why not give the Quiet Morning on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> Feb a try?

And our Lent Course this year helps us reflect on our own journey of faith - as well as learning how we might share that experience more confidently with friends.



Whatever you do, may you go a bit deeper, develop your roots, that together we may be fruitful for God.



Reflect: What can you learn from this psalm about dealing with terrible suffering?

Reading 3: Isaiah 9:2-7

Reflect: Ponder the four names for the Messiah. What does each mean to your life? Why?

☐ Reading 4: Job 19:23-27

Reflect: How does Jesus' death and resurrection affect the way you feel about your death?

Reading 5: Micah 5:2-5

Reflect: How does Micah's prophecy help you trust that Jesus is the promised Savior?

#### New Year New Challenge

Looking back, it's hard to believe that I have been here at Apoolo Na Angor (ANA) (pictured above) for just over six months, and whilst it has not always been a smooth journey, I remain encouraged by many of the achievements and developments within the different projects that ANA undertakes, and the improvements that are made to the livelihoods of the community ANA serves here in the Bukedea district of Eastern Uganda. Whilst my main involvement over recent months has mainly been with the community development programme; working with the Field Extension Officers (FEO's), the Skills Academy has had a very busy end of year in preparing for the December Graduation.

#### ANA Skills Academy Graduation 2014

35 trainees graduated following their Nov. examinations and were presented with their certificates by the local female Member of Parliament. The day was the highlight of ANA's year, with over 1,200 guests attending; family & friends of the trainees along with members of the Women's Groups that the FEOs work with.

#### The Community comes to St Matthias

What an amazing place this is!
Before I started working here I
attended church on a Sunday but I
admit I was pretty much unaware of



what went on in the church centre. And then I took up residence in the small office downstairs and my eyes were opened!

The centre is filled day after day with interest groups big and small offering a variety of activities to serve the local community. There are keep-fit classes - some gentle, some to make you puff, groups for the very young (parents and toddlers) and the not so young (TOFFS for the over fifties), a variety of U3A groups (University of the Third Age) from quizzes to singing and art history, recorded music, all things 'cornish' (The Cornish Society) and a huge choir of over a hundred. Every week they come and go serving the local people.

There is a club which only ever happens on a Thursday (The Thursday Club!), and one which only ever happens on the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month (but not on Christmas Day!), there are counsellors, MPs surgeries, business training courses etc etc. And, there are also the many activities which are run by the church itself – Alpha, Messy Church and more.

What a wonderful resource the church centre provides for the community.

In the first of a regular feature for the magazine, one of the hirers has been asked to write an article about the work they do. Devon in Sight are a local charity working for people with sight loss and have written the first article which you will find on the next page.

Look out for an article from another hirer in the next magazine.

Devon in Sight is a small independent charity providing practical help and advice to many of the 35,000 people in Devon and Torbay affected by sight loss. Our aim is to maximise people's independence, wellbeing and choice. We have a Resource Centre in Topsham where our Advisers provide information on common sight loss issues and help identify what support is needed. They also help people assess different pieces of equipment that will help them with day to day living such as lighting, magnifiers, talking clocks and watches, phones, tablet computers and kitchen equipment. Low Vision Assessment Clinics, Employment and Assistive Technology clinics take place at the Resource Centre.

We also offer 'Skills for Seeing' training to maximise the best use of any vision remaining for watching TV, reading and getting about, at our Topsham Centre and at Jasmyn House, Midvale Road, Paignton.

In Torbay we offer a Volunteer Visiting Service which has been running since 2008 to provide befriending and emotional support to people with sight loss. The service helps to improve people's quality of life, maintain independence and tackle social isolation. We now support over 100 individuals through a committed group of around 100 volunteers who annually put in over 6,400 hours of their own time to make the service the success that it is. Our volunteers are incredibly important to us and some are able to give a regular weekly commitment and others once a month, but either way all are equally valued. We also run regular meetings to provide training and support to our amazing Volunteer Visiting Service Volunteers and all our volunteers receive the Community Sighted Guiding training.

So being a volunteer with us is both rewarding and interesting and we are always on the lookout for new volunteers so if you feel you would like to find out more please contact:

Supported by Molly, his wife, they made a significant contribution towards the life of St Matthias and community of Wellswood


Peter shared how, in the 1950's, listening to a Billy Graham Crusade on the radio, God had reached through to him, making a big




