### **Readings for Today**

#### 1 Corinthians 12:1, 4-7, 12 (GNB)

Now, concerning what you wrote about the gifts from the Holy Spirit. I want you to know the truth about them, my friends...

<sup>4</sup>There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. <sup>5</sup>There are different ways of serving, but the same Lord is served. <sup>6</sup>There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives ability to all for their particular service. <sup>7</sup>The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person for the good of all...

<sup>12</sup> Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.

#### **Romans 12:3-8** (GNB)

And because of God's gracious gift to me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you should. Instead, be modest in your thinking, and judge yourself according to the amount of faith that God has given you.<sup>4</sup> We have many parts in the one body, and all these parts have different functions. <sup>5</sup> In the same way, though we are many, we are one body in union with Christ, and we are all joined to each other as different parts of one body. <sup>6</sup> So we are to use our different gifts in accordance with the grace that God has given us. If our gift is to speak God's message, we should do it according to the faith that we have; <sup>7</sup> if it is to serve, we should serve; if it is to teach, we should teach; <sup>8</sup> if it is to encourage others, we should do so. Whoever shares with others should do it generously; whoever has authority should work hard; whoever shows kindness to others should do it cheerfully.

#### Luke 4:14-21 (NIV)

<sup>14</sup> Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside. <sup>15</sup> He was teaching in their synagogues, and everyone praised him. <sup>16</sup> He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, <sup>17</sup> and the scroll of the prophet

Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:

<sup>18</sup> 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners, and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, <sup>19</sup> to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

<sup>20</sup> Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. <sup>21</sup> He began by saying to them, 'Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.'
