Summary of Financial Situation at St Matthias

During the 5 years up to 2013 we built up a cumulative deficit of some £70,000 and, to remain solvent, we had to draw heavily on our Reserves, thus substantially depleting them. In 2014 we thankfully saw a reversal of this trend, so that, excluding legacy income (for which we are extremely grateful – and indeed have needed for anything other than routine costs), our giving just slightly exceeded our expenditure.

Encouraged by this response, the PCC have just taken the courageous and faithful step of giving away 10% of our regular income (up until now it has been about 6%) to a range of Christian charities. This is one key way that together, as a church, we can extend God's kingdom beyond the boundaries of St Matthias'. As a church, we want to be generous to others as God is generous to us.

However, looking at the figures for this year to the end of August and subtracting legacy income (even higher this year), the situation is almost identical to the same period in 2014. Although we have seen a modest increase in voluntary giving this alone is not enough to make a substantial improvement to our Balance Sheet. *The challenge for all church members is, therefore, for those that do give on a regular basis, to review their levels of giving and, for those that do not, to consider whether they are able to make such a financial commitment to support St Matthias in its mission to our local and wider communities. A healthy, sustainable Balance Sheet would, potentially, enable us to do so much more than we are currently able to do!*

Our preferred method of regular giving is now the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS), which a number of people have signed up for over the last few months. It would be appreciated if more people would now consider this method of giving and, accordingly, a leaflet is included in this Notice Sheet which explains the essential elements of the scheme and how to subscribe to it.



The Parish Giving Scheme was developed to provide a modern solution to offset one of the greatest threats to parish income, that of static giving. *How it works – based on example of initial donation of £60 per month:*




One of the major advantages of the scheme is that there is an option to increase the donation annually by the rate of inflation with no need for the donor to change instructions to their bank.

Based on the example of a £60 per month donation, this would produce an annual income (including Gift Aid) of £900. The following comparison table shows the difference between maintaining this donation at the same level for 5 years and increasing it by 2.5% per annum (a typical/modest rate of inflation):

Based on a projected annual Planned Giving figure of £60,000 (total Gift Aided giving for Envelopes and Standing Orders), over the next 5 years, if inflation proofed, this would produce an extra £29,000 for a relatively small increase per donor. Over a longer period the increased income becomes even more dramatic.

The chart shows the annual income figures with and without inflation. The cumulative additional income over this 10 year period amounts to a staggering **£111,000!!** All achieved with inflation proofing of donations.



Apart from the inflation proofing element that this scheme provides there are also several other benefits:

- Gift Aid administration carried out on our behalf at no cost to us (currently this causes us a considerable amount of work)
- Gross donation (inc. G/A) paid into our church current account within 10 days (on monthly cycle)
- Considerably improved cash flow
- Direct Debit provides greater flexibility (changes much easier to implement than with Standing Orders)
- More predictable income stream if majority participate
- Option for donor to remain anonymous (within church context)

All members of St Matthias are asked to prayerfully consider whether they are able to sign up to the scheme.

If you currently give by **Standing Order** then the transition to Direct Debit is very simple.

If you give via the **Weekly Envelope System** then it obviously involves a more substantial change but, as well as greatly benefitting the church, once the Direct Debit is set up it becomes a simpler way of making a regular donation.

If you give via the **Blue Envelopes** or the **Collection Plate** then please consider whether you could convert to this system.

Malachi 3: 6-12
