Readings

Romans 3:21-26 (New International Version NIV)

²¹ But now apart from the law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. ²² This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. ²⁵ God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished— ²⁶ he did it to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus.

Luke 15:1-10 (New International Version NIVUK)

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering round to hear Jesus. ² But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, 'This man welcomes sinners, and eats with them.'

³ Then Jesus told them this parable: ⁴ 'Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ⁵ And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶ and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbours together and says, "Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep." ⁷ I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who do not need to repent.

⁸ 'Or suppose a woman has ten silver coins and loses one. Doesn't she light a lamp, sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ And when she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbours together and says, "Rejoice with me; I have found my lost coin." ¹⁰ In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'

Wellspring - when will it happen?


As many will know, after 4 years of planning, in July 2018, we gained the permissions we need to go ahead with the reordering of the church to enable us to worship and witness to **the** Well*spring* – Jesus – the source of 'living water' who invites us into life in all its fullness.

The architect is currently working on detailed drawings with a local quantity surveyor and structural engineer, and specialist heating and lighting advisors so that tenders for the work can be sent to about 5 local firms just after Christmas.

We're likely to choose one main contractor but there will be many other specialist workers too, for example for the joinery, furniture, glazing, electrical and heating work.

The process of drawing up a contract ensures best value for each part and for the whole. Hopefully, the early estimate of £850,000 will get reduced when we have more accurate figures when tenders come back in late January 2019.

Once the PCC have reviewed these documents, with advice from the new 'REM Group' (Re-ordering and Maintenance), we hope to be able to say 'Yes, go ahead' in early February at that point - if we have enough money!



Wellspring Appeal

We're wanting to fund 3 phases of the work. Thanks to generous giving from the congregation last year, and from legacies gifted to the church and to the Friends (who have also been fundraising in other ways), we have nearly £500,000 already available, and are busy applying for grant money.

However, to begin the work in Spring 2019, for the first phase, we need your financial support please. APPEAL AS AT NOVEMBER 2018 £800 - £850,000 (ACTUAL COSTS EXPECTED END JAN 19)



More accurate costs are due in January 2019, but for now, our estimates are:

- ➤ For the 1st phase, for the main internal works, including the new glass doorways, we estimate we'll need a further £78,000 ideally by end of January 2019.
- ➤ The 2nd phase, to redesign and landscape the west piazza, we'll need a further £132,000.
- ➤ And the 3rd phase, to significantly improve the chancel seating and create a better 'prayer space' in the Francis Chapel will need a further £61,000.
