#### Collect

Gracious God, you call us to fullness of life: deliver us from unbelief and banish our anxieties with the liberating love of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen "Paraclesis" - What's that?! It's the Greek New Testament word for how we 'come alongside' one another to offer comfort, love and help, following the example of the Holy Spirit, or 'paraclete' who comes alongside us and is the basis for our teaching this month.

### Readings

#### John 5: 1-15

Some time later, Jesus went up to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish festivals. <sup>2</sup> Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. <sup>3</sup> Here a great number of disabled people used to lie – the blind, the lame, the paralysed. <sup>5</sup> One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. <sup>6</sup> When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, 'Do you want to get well?' <sup>7</sup> 'Sir,' the invalid replied, 'I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me.' <sup>8</sup> Then Jesus said to him, 'Get up! Pick up your mat and walk.' <sup>9</sup> At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked. The day on which this took place was a Sabbath, <sup>10</sup> and so the Jewish leaders said to the man who had been healed, 'It is the Sabbath; the law forbids you to carry your mat.' <sup>11</sup> But he replied, 'The man who made me well said to me, "Pick up your mat and walk."'

<sup>12</sup> So they asked him, 'Who is this fellow who told you to pick it up and walk?'
<sup>13</sup> The man who was healed had no idea who it was, for Jesus had slipped away into the crowd that was there. <sup>14</sup> Later Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, 'See, you are well again. Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you.' <sup>15</sup> The man went away and told the Jewish leaders that it was Jesus who had made him well.

#### Psalm 25: 1-12

In you, LORD my God,

I put my trust.

<sup>2</sup> I trust in you;

do not let me be put to shame,

nor let my enemies triumph over me.

- <sup>3</sup> No one who hopes in you will ever be put to shame,
- but shame will come on those who are treacherous without cause.

<sup>4</sup> Show me your ways, LORD, teach me your paths.

<sup>5</sup> Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour,

and my hope is in you all day long.

<sup>6</sup> Remember, LORD, your great mercy and love,

for they are from of old.

<sup>7</sup> Do not remember the sins of my youth

and my rebellious ways;

according to your love remember me, for you, LORD, are good.

<sup>8</sup> Good and upright is the LORD;

therefore he instructs sinners in his ways.

<sup>9</sup> He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way.

<sup>10</sup> All the ways of the LORD are loving and faithful

toward those who keep the demands of his covenant.

<sup>11</sup> For the sake of your name, LORD,

forgive my iniquity, though it is great. <sup>12</sup> Who, then, are those who fear the LORD?

He will instruct them in the ways they should choose.

#### Isaiah 42: 1-7

'Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him,

and he will bring justice to the nations.

- <sup>2</sup> He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets.
- <sup>3</sup> A bruised reed he will not break, and a smouldering wick he will not snuff out.

In faithfulness he will bring forth justice;

<sup>4</sup> he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth.

In his teaching the islands will put their hope.'

<sup>5</sup> This is what God the LORD says – the Creator of the heavens, who stretches them out,

who spreads out the earth with all that springs from it,

who gives breath to its people, and life to those who walk on it:

<sup>6</sup> 'I, the LORD, have called you in righteousness;

I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you and will make you

to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles,

<sup>7</sup> to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.
