Exodus 34:29-32

²⁹ When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD. ³⁰ When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. ³² Afterwards all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the LORD had given him on Mount Sinai.

2 Peter 1:16-18

¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised stories when we told you about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but we were eye-witnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ He received honour and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.' ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.

Matthew 17:1-9

After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. ² There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. ³ Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus.

- ⁴Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.'
- ⁵ While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!'
- ⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell face down to the ground, terrified. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them. 'Get up,' he said. 'Don't be afraid.' ⁸ When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.
- ⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, 'Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

The PCC believe we should be replacing our part-time youth and children's worker post with a full time one. This person would oversee the ministry to the children, youth and families.

In addition to the large number of children and young people in our church family, who we want to help grow as disciples, we have many great opportunities to reach out to families and children in our preschool and local primary schools.

However, the costs of employing someone must be met from our church family income, which is why we are launching this Appeal. It is a lot of money - we need about £27,000 per year to include salary, pension and NI etc.

But God has provided us with the money we needed for Wellspring* and we believe that this is another step of faith which He is calling us to take. Please think and pray about whether God might be calling you to support this work financially.

- ➤ If so, please do so without reducing any existing giving our 'Common Fund' payment to the diocese has increased from £93,000 this year to nearly £100,000 for 2020.
- We would much prefer to be able to offer someone more than a oneyear post, so if you were able to pledge money over 2 or more years that would also be very helpful.

Could God be calling you to help complete some grant applications to various trusts (either for this or to cover the outstanding Wellspring balance)?

We would like to advertise as soon as possible – so please let Tony Barratt know **before** Sunday 29th March.

*By the end of 2019, of a budget figure of around £832,000, we only have £38,000 outstanding. Wow! Praise God! We believe that a combination of some surplus PCC 2019 income, some further gifts from Friends and further grants (if someone is prepared to seek them!) should result in less than £10,000 remaining at the end of 2020. If need be, we can use some of our reserves to cover this payment, re-paying the reserves over the next few years, providing that the general giving in the Church continues to be healthy.

Messages

Coronavirus The latest advice this week from the Church of England about reducing risks of infection at Communion services in particular states that, so long as we follow the current 'best practice', then there is no need to take any extra precautions at present. Sharing the common cup of wine has a very low risk of passing infection of any type, but since our hands are a vehicle by which most infections are transmitted, we need to keep them clean. We will have alcohol gel available (on the

low cupboards at back of church) for everyone to use as they arrive, especially if they are feeling unwell, or blowing their nose a lot! The priest, and Holy Communion administrants, will also use the alcohol hand gel. If you are unwell, or are concerned about using the chalice, please either just receive the bread/wafer and/or ask for the non-alcoholic wine which is in separate disposable glasses. Contrary to what many of us were told many years ago, please do not dip your bread/wafer into the chalice (sometimes called 'intinction'). This has been proven to pass on infections far more effectively than drinking from the same chalice, because our hands can infect the chalice for everyone else! (It also has the potential to contaminate the chalice with gluten which may be harmful to someone who is gluten-intolerant). Thank you for helping us reduce the risks of this awful disease spreading so fast.
