LOSS OF INCOME FOR ST MATTHIAS DURING COVID-19 CRISIS

First of all I would like to sincerely thank all those who continue to give regularly each month via the Parish Giving Scheme or by Standing Orders. Your generosity is very much appreciated and will hopefully continue to provide a large proportion of our voluntary income during the Coronavirus crisis. Our thanks also go to those members of our congregation who give cash each Sunday as the offering plates come round.

Because the Church, Centre and Pre-School are now closed until further notice, our other sources of income are going to be severely impacted so there will be considerable pressure on our finances as there are still significant regular bills to pay, including our Common Fund payment of £8,272 per month and other essential items such as our buildings insurance, fire and intruder alarms etc. We are also committed to continuing our support of various mission and other charitable organisations via the Mission Action Group, thus providing help to others less fortunate than ourselves, which is even more critical during this time of crisis. This means that we are going to be even more reliant on voluntary income, one element of which is the Sunday offerings, either via cash donations in the collection plate or those who continue to give via the blue and yellow envelope schemes, which give us the benefit of claiming gift aid. Clearly none of these sources are now possible for the time being.

THIS IS A PLEA TO ALL THOSE WHO GIVE VIA ENVELOPES OR CASH TO PLEASE CONSIDER CHANGING OVER TO, PREFERABLY, THE PGS SCHEME OR, ALTERNATIVELY, BACS TRANSFER INTO OUR CHURCH BANK ACCOUNT VIA A STANDING ORDER.

If you would be prepared to change over to the PGS scheme, which has now become our preferred method, this is now much easier than the method referred to in the previous notice as there is a new online registration facility to make donations by **TELEPHONE** (no need to post off any paperwork). All you need to do is to log in to the PGS web site with the following link: https://register.parishgiving.org.uk and follow the instructions to register.

Please be assured that the donation would remain totally under your control at all times and can be changed or cancelled at any time by making a simple phone call.

A second alternative is to set up a standing order to make a regular donation via BACS transfer from your bank, which can easily be done online. If you would prefer to do this then our bank details are as follows:

It is also recognised that the crisis may be causing financial hardship to some of our church community so please do not feel pressurised to respond to this request if you are personally affected in this way.
