Learning from Philippians this week:

Marks of the community – part 2 – no grumbling!

Last week, we began our look at chapter 2, and Andrew Green enabled us to learn about harmony, and humility as we are urged to follow the example of Jesus – *if you didn't catch that sermon, why not find it in last week's YouTube 11am service? (it's about 9 minutes in!)*. Today, we continue that lesson, understanding why Paul's instruction about 'no grumbling' is so important to us as a church family.

Church Opening and Online Worship Update

As you may know, we've begun to open the doors of the church again \odot



So far, this is just on Wednesday mornings, 10am – 1230pm, and also Saturday 4th July. As with all of the Covid guidelines, this is likely to

change – even this week! The Government guidelines for places of worship were only released on 29th June, and the clergy of the Diocese have just had an online briefing on Friday 3rd July – with a second set of guidance notes since Tuesday to review how the 'private prayer' opening has



worked out, and to digest the latest guidelines, with a view to deciding what sort of church services we can hold. It is fair to say that the requirements for social distancing and sanitising and the restrictions on numbers of people who can come, means that any worship service will be so different that it is hard to assess what sort of worship we can offer together safely – especially when it comes to sharing Holy Communion.

Until then, do join in the online worship – and do keep checking the church website and notices carefully for updates. Don't be surprised if you are still feeling very disorientated about life, frustrated about not being able to get to church, or finding prayer difficult. It is bound to be different and wearying without the usual routines that help us stay in touch with God and without the support of one another face to face.
