**Forgiveness.** As Jesus reminds us, God is still at work. He has an amazing vision. His invitation to partner with Him to bring in more and more of his Kingdom – where everything runs as God intends it to run – hasn't changed because of covid-19 – indeed there are more things than ever that are not as God wants them to be.

# Next week, 20<sup>th</sup> September for the first time for months, we're planning to celebrate Holy Communion at 11am ©

The usual sanitising and face covering rules still apply – removing your face covering just to receive the bread of communion (and sadly we still cannot sing). This is all of course subject to detailed guidance from the government and Church of England in the light of the recent change in law to restrict social gatherings to a group of six. At present, we do not expect this to change the way we have church services. On 9<sup>th</sup> September, the Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally is quoted as saying:

"I welcome confirmation from the Prime Minister that places of worship can still hold more than six people in total, despite the new restrictions on gatherings, and the reassurance that public worship can continue.

"We will continue to work with the Government on specific areas relating to our churches and church-based activities."

Please do not come into church if you are unwell, self-isolating, in the shielded group or looking after someone who is in that category.
