#### Live Services - update - managing the risk

Thank you for replying to the recent mini survey we sent out by email and by phone, and for the many helpful comments. As a result of these, and with the national trend of increasing covid-19 cases, the PCC concluded this week that now is not the time to be increasing the number of 'live' services in church any further. In any event we do not have sufficient stewards nor time to run two services in any one Sunday morning. We will be reviewing the situation before Christmas.



In addition to the legal requirements, the Church of England has published detailed guidance about how to reduce the Covid-19 risk when we conduct our Holy Communion services and include one or two practices which may seem strange if you are unaware of them.

Here are a few points to note:

- Words at distribution of the Bread the priest is not to say anything when sharing the bread to reduce the risk of any viral droplets going onto the wafers or being breathed in by the communicant, so says the words before starting to distribute the bread. We have not changed our thinking about what we mean by 'The Body of Christ, keep you in eternal life'.
- PLEASE keep the 2m distancing wherever you are in church this applies to when you stand at the Communion rail too – there are white markers at 2m spaces on the carpet on the dais edge to help you with this.
- PLEASE leave promptly when the services end in church, and do not stay chatting - again, it is a sad reality but we owe it to one another to reduce risk where we can.
- And whenever you do come to church, please come wrapped up in warm clothes and coats – the heating will have been on, but to reduce the risk further, we are keeping some doors and windows open. It's not ideal, but safer this way.


For our praise and prayers this week
