



A note from the Rectory...."Christmas is cancelled"? Hardly...

...but it is a real disappointment not to have Christmas family meals that many have long looked forward to – and now have fridges full of food! It's sad too, that with limited numbers, we are not able to all meet in person for our family meal of Holy Communion – nor to sing in celebration!

Yet, we're still 'family' whether we meet up in person for Christmas or not. Indeed, one of the 'comforts and joys' of Christmas is to hear again the wonderful beginning of John's gospel where we are told that Christ's coming gives us power to become children of God.

Christmas reminds us we belong, and are beloved.

Having said that, as church family, at the end of the year, it's good to take stock of our life together.

We can celebrate all the new ways we have learned to stay in touch – with Zoom and having so many people contributing to our online worship. We've been able to contact people who we haven't been in touch with for years. We have witnessed the wonderful outpouring of kindness to neighbours. However, life remains difficult.

In the 6th Century BC the Jewish people were in Exile. They were forcibly removed to another land, and their Temple was destroyed. They found it hard to adapt to new ways of worship away from all that was familiar. "How can we sing the songs of the LORD while in a foreign land?" (Ps 137 v4) You may feel just the same.

Yet we have the opportunity to learn something really important. Our faith does not need to depend on meeting God in a particular place or way. Remember Jesus is 'Emmanuel', 'God with us' – everywhere, and all the time!

It isn't always easy though to learn new ways to worship and pray. I wonder whether you have found any new routines of prayer and worship and bible reading at home? Remember, when we worship at home we are connected in praise and worship with our brothers and sisters all over the world!

So, for this New Year, can we encourage you to:

Persevere in kindness.

Persevere in seeking the face of God in prayer and worship from your home.

Persevere with regular Sunday worship with the rest of the church family – in person or as part of the growing online community – and do sing out your praise to God in the only place you can at the moment – at home!

We have an amazing God, who loves us so much He sent His only begotten Son at Christmas to be with us. Let's continue as a family to offer him worship because He is worth it.
