

meeting on Monday, for the next few months. This is following a series of consultations and advice, including a meeting of all clergy in the Diocese with the Archdeacons and Rev Prof Radford (until 2019, the Deputy Chief Medical Officer for England and a Team Vicar in the Diocese).

Lockdown 3 – a note from the Rectory - a copy of the letter emailed out this week Dear St. Matthias family

So, we're in 'lockdown 3' - which while clearly needed, still makes life very difficult.

The stresses surrounding the situation continue to assail us, so we continue to cry out to the Lord for His mercy and help.

While we pray, we also have to make wise decisions about the ways we can meet in person as a church family. The Bishop of London wrote this to guide us this Monday just after the Prime Minister's announcement of the national lockdown:

"The Government has chosen not to suspend public worship in England at this time....However, some may feel that it is currently better not to attend in person, and there will be parishes which decide to offer only digital services for the time-being. Clergy who have concerns, and others who are shielding, should take particular care and stay at home".

After consulting the Standing Committee of the PCC, the Staff team, and receiving medical advice, we have decided to suspend our 'public' in person worship services for the time being. The increased infectious nature of the new variant of covid-19, and the rapid local rise in cases increases the risk of infection significantly. Further, we feel we should be showing solidarity with everyone else in the community undergoing restrictions, and not carrying on as if nothing had changed.

While the PCC will review the situation at their meeting next Monday, it is clear that we are not alone in making this decision – other churches in Torbay and across Devon are doing likewise.

Instead, we shall continue to offer our 9.30am 'Zone' services online, and also stream the usual 11am services live from the church building. We are also going to open the church for private prayer on Sundays 9 - 10am and 3 - 4pm as well as Wednesdays 10 - 11am.

Yesterday's bible reading in Morning Prayer from Isaiah 62, where the prophet longs for the time when God's kingdom is fully here, symbolised by the restoration of Jerusalem, very clearly urges us to keep on praying:

You who call on the LORD,

give yourselves no rest,

and give him no rest till he establishes Jerusalem

and makes her the praise of the earth.

So do please keep praying for God's mercy on our world, and for one another in the church family, here and beyond. God bless John
