My strict control over my diet, exercise and rest seems to have paid off eventually and I have gradually begun to feel much better. I am now very grateful to be able to walk as far as I want to at sea level and on relatively flat ground without shortness of breath or chest pain. A real joy! Stairs are definitely getting easier and I'm looking forward to testing myself on hills and at higher altitude in the coming months. Thank you for your prayers!

After the course in Liverpool ended, I moved back to Oxford where I hope to be based for the next couple of months. I spent a lovely week in Plymouth over Christmas seeing friends and then spent most of January in South Africa seeing my family. After a gap of about 15 months, it was brilliant to be able to see my family again. Although I didn't manage to do everything I had hoped to do, I really enjoyed the beautiful warm weather and some time at the beach.

I know from my email inbox that many of you are very keen to find out what my next placement with CMS might be. So am I! Over the past few months there have been several meetings and plenty of emails and WhatsApps about different opportunities and one seems to have emerged as a good potential match, however it's still too early to share specific details. I'm sorry, I know you really want to know!


