Psalm 27

The Lord is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear?

The Lord is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?

² When the wicked advance against me to devour me,

it is my enemies and my foes who will stumble and fall.

³Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear;

though war break out against me, even then I will be confident.

⁴One thing I ask from the Lord, this only do I seek:

that I may dwell in the house of the Lord

all the days of my life,

to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple.

⁵ For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling; he will hide me in the shelter of his sacred tent

and set me high upon a rock.

⁶Then my head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me;

at his sacred tent I will sacrifice with

shouts of joy;

I will sing and make music to the Lord.

⁷ Hear my voice when I call, Lord; be merciful to me and answer me.

⁸ My heart says of you, 'Seek his face!' Your face, Lord, I will seek.

⁹ Do not hide your face from me, do not turn your servant away in anger;

you have been my helper.

Do not reject me or forsake me, God my Saviour.

¹⁰ Though my father and mother forsake me,

the Lord will receive me.

¹¹Teach me your way, Lord; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors.

¹² Do not hand me over to the desire of my foes,

for false witnesses rise up against me,

spouting malicious accusations.

¹³ I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.

Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.

³¹ At that time some Pharisees came to Jesus and said to him, 'Leave this place and go somewhere else. Herod wants to kill you.'

³² He replied, 'Go and tell that fox, "I will keep on driving out demons and healing people today and tomorrow, and on the third day I will reach my goal." ³³ In any case, I must press on today and tomorrow and the next day – for surely no prophet can die outside Jerusalem! ³⁴ 'Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were not willing. ³⁵ Look, your house is left to you desolate. I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."'
