

TODAY! Encounter | 21st November | 5:30-6:30pm

We're really excited to be launching a new informal gathering called 'Encounter.' It's a youth-led gathering but for the whole church. It'll focus on sung worship, hearing from the Bible, and prayer ministry in a covid-safe way. We'd love to see you there!

Masks work well – that's the conclusion of researchers reporting in the British Medical Journal: "Mask-wearing is the single most effective public health measure at tackling Covid, reducing incidence by 53%, the first global study of its kind shows...mask-wearing, social distancing and handwashing are all effective at curbing cases, with mask-wearing the most effective". So, thanks for continuing to wear a mask when you come to church. We know it is difficult, but given Torbay's case rates are currently 40% higher than the national average, please be kind and think of how you might protect someone else. Readings for today

Philippians 2: 1-18

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, ² then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. ³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

- ⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:
- ⁶ who, being in very nature God,
 - did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;
- ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing
 - by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.
- ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death – even death on a cross!

- ⁹Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,
- ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
- ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Do everything without grumbling

- ¹² Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³ for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfil his good purpose.
- ¹⁴ Do everything without grumbling or arguing, ¹⁵ so that you may become blameless and pure, 'children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.' Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky ¹⁶ as you hold firmly to the word of life. And then I will be able to boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labour in vain. ¹⁷ But even if I am being poured out like a drink offering on the sacrifice and service coming from your faith, I am glad and rejoice with all of you. ¹⁸ So you too should be glad and rejoice with me.

John 19: 33-37

³³ But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. ³⁴ Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. ³⁵ The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe. ³⁶ These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: 'Not one of his bones will be broken,' ³⁷ and, as another scripture says, 'They will look on the one they have pierced.'
