# Reading for Today

Luke 10: 38-42

<sup>38</sup> As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. <sup>39</sup> She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. <sup>40</sup> But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, 'Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!'

<sup>41</sup> 'Martha, Martha,' the Lord answered, 'you are worried and upset about many things, <sup>42</sup> but few things are needed – or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.'

**Homes for Ukraine Scheme** The situation with the Homes for Ukraine Scheme is developing rapidly. The Diocese has put together a working group to assist people with finding refugees to host as well as looking at ways to support

refugees and their sponsors. We are expecting the first family of 3 to arrive at St Matthias in the next 2 weeks. We have our own action group (URAG) so that we can support those staying in our parish and across the Bay. At the moment, we are concentrating on meeting the refugees' physical needs but we wish to help them integrate into the community. Many thanks to everyone who has offered to help. There will be many opportunities over the coming weeks and we will keep you informed of what the needs are.
